

Information clause for authors of articles submitted for publication in the Quarterly "Studia Regionalne i Lokalne"

According to art. 12 section 1 and 13 section 1 and 2 of the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46 / EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (OJ EU L 119) - hereinafter referred to as RODO, we would like to inform you that:

1. The administrator of your personal data is the University of Warsaw with its registered office at Krakowskie Przedmieście 26/28, 00-927 in Warsaw, NIP: 525-001-12-66, REGON: 000001258.

3. Your personal data by the University of Warsaw will be processed on the basis of:
 - art. 6 par. 1 letter b) - in order to conduct the reviewing procedure and publish an article of your authorship in the Quarterly " Studia Regionalne i Lokalne ",
 - art. 6 par. 1 letter f) - in order to maintain the possibility of contact by the editors of the quarterly "Studia Regionalne i Lokalne", with you after the publication of the article.
4. Providing your personal data is necessary to conduct a review procedure and publish your article. Providing personal data is not obligatory, but failure to do so will make it impossible to publish the article.
5. The recipients of your personal data will be the following categories of entities: scientific publishing houses, scientific journals databases, users of the website www.studreg.uw.edu.pl.
6. In terms of the legal basis based on processing for the purpose of pursuing the contract or seeking to conclude it (Article 6 (1) b), your personal data will be processed for the duration of the contract and after it until the claims arising from it are time-barred.
7. As regards the legal basis based on the justified interest of the Administrator (Article 6 (1) letter f), your personal data will be processed until you object to the processing of this data.
8. You have the right to access your personal data, rectify them, delete or limit processing, as well as the right to transfer data, the right to object to the processing.
9. You have the right to lodge a complaint to the President of the Office for Personal Data Protection if consider that the processing of personal data relating to you violates applicable law.
10. Based on your personal data, the Administrator will not take automated decisions against you, including decisions resulting from profiling.
